TKP: The Beginning and Now

The Kingdom Projects (TKP) is a missionary (non-denominational, non-governmental) organization committed to mobilizing, recruiting, training, and sending Christian professionals, technicians, and artisans to reach the unreached nations with the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. TKP comprises Tent-Making Missionaries, Associate Missionaries, Conventional Missionaries, Mission Financiers, and Mission Intercessors, all united with a single purpose of enthroning Jesus Christ over the unreached Nations.

TKP began in 1996 in Nigeria. The founding and the incumbent International Director, Pastor Olusola Adebayo a servant of God on a mission with deep sense of conviction and calling together with his beloved wife Mrs. Funmi Adebayo (Deputy International Direction) have through the help of the Holy Spirit and support systems of called, chosen and committed members of

the Body of Christ and the big TKP family taken TKP to different parts of the world. The Kingdom Projects' operations have extended to various countries and continents. Presently, we have missionaries in West Africa, East Africa, Central Africa, South Africa, Europe, the United States of America, Canada, and Australia.

TKP began in Uganda in 2016 when the Olaniyans (Dr. Ademola Olaniyan & Dr. Susan Olaniyan) were deployed to Uganda as Tent-Making missionaries. TKP became registered with the government of Uganda in September 2018 as a Continental NGO. TKP Uganda serves as a springboard through which TKP was lunched to different East African Communities; Kenya and Rwanda (currently) and South Africa. Efforts are ongoing for TKP to be registered in Kenya and to have her presence in other East and Southern Africa countries.

Touching Lives at Christmas Outreach in East Africa

Touching Lives at Christmas (TLC) is an outreach with many strategies that gives every believer a golden opportunity to connect the needy souls with their saviour on Christmas Day. The maiden edition of TLC in East Africa was in Kenya and Uganda in 2016. Dr Tayo Akinlabi (a PhD candidate then) maximised his short break between completing his Master's Degree program and commencing his PhD to pioneer TLC in Nairobi, Kenya. What a great lesson in maximizing every opportunity to fulfil the divine mandate of making Christ known. TLC was a success in Nairobi that year. Dr Tayo and his wife now lead TKP-United States of America.

In 2016, a team of 22 participants from 6 different countries, who were then based in Kampala, were led to the first TLC in Uganda. What a historic moment, from then TLC has spread to different parts of Uganda and other countries.

In 2017, TLC reached Rwanda through the commitment and service of Brother Jeremiah and Sister Mayokun Soetan (TKP Australia). TLC has since been holding in Kigali, Rwanda.

TLC entered South Sudan in December 2025 when Brother Oscar Olwedo left the shores of Uganda to pioneer TLC in South Sudan. It was a bold step and courageous effort on the part of this young man to take TLC to a war-torn state of the East African Community.

TLC spread into various communities mentioned above because some young people dare to make a change, dare to be different and challenge status quo, take the bull by the horn to see the gospel of Christ spread to communities. You can also take a step today!!!

“Wisdom is the principal thing; therefore, get wisdom: and with all thy getting get understanding.” - Proverbs 4:7 (KJV)

Introduction

We live in a world defined by speed, pressure, and constant change. Intelligence is celebrated, trends shift rapidly, and success is often measured by visibility rather than value. Yet amid the noise of modern life, Scripture presents an unchanging truth. Wisdom is the principal thing. It is not reserved for the elderly or for scholars alone. It is God's invitation to this generation to live with clarity, direction, and lasting impact. This wisdom is not hidden or unattainable. It is accessible, transformative, and urgently needed.

What Wisdom Really Is?


Biblical wisdom goes far beyond intelligence, eloquence, or academic success. While knowledge informs, wisdom directs. It is heavenly sense, not merely common sense. True wisdom is knowledge rightly applied, guided by discernment and grounded in the fear of the Lord (Proverbs 9:10). It enables believers to see beyond appearances, make godly decisions, and remain aligned with God's will even when culture pulls in the opposite direction.

James 3:17 describes wisdom from above as pure, peaceable, gentle, open to reason, full of mercy and good fruit, impartial and sincere. This wisdom does not only shape how we think. It transforms how we live, relate, study, lead, and serve.

Why Young People Desperately Need Wisdom?

Being young today comes with intense pressure. Young people are expected to define their future early, excel academically, navigate relationships, and remain socially relevant, often simultaneously. Without wisdom, zeal becomes burnout, passion becomes pain, and ambition becomes destruction. That is why wisdom is not optional. It is essential.

Scripture gives us powerful examples. Joseph in Egypt, Daniel in Babylon, and Esther in Persia were young people navigating hostile environments. What distinguished them was not popularity or privilege, but wisdom from God. That wisdom positioned them as solution-bearers and agents of divine influence in their generation.



Wisdom Is a Gift. Ask for It

God does not withhold wisdom. He gives it generously to those who ask with sincerity and humility. James 1:5 assures us that anyone who lacks wisdom should ask God, who gives without reproach. God is not demanding perfection. He is inviting dependence.

When facing career decisions, academic pressure, peer influence, or emotional uncertainty, divine wisdom provides stability. Solomon's request in 1 Kings 3 was not for wealth or power, but for wisdom, and God honored that request abundantly. The same invitation remains open today.

Walking in Winning Wisdom

Winning wisdom is cultivated intentionally. It begins with a genuine relationship with God, nurtured through prayer, worship, and Scripture. God's Word becomes a lamp to guide daily decisions (Psalm 119:105). Wisdom also grows through relationships. Walking with the wise sharpens character, while poor associations corrupt it (Proverbs 13:20; 1 Corinthians 15:33).

Wisdom teaches balance. Spiritual growth and academic excellence are not competitors. Both can flourish together (Ecclesiastes 3:1). It also requires obedience. Wisdom is lived, not merely learned. As Scripture reminds us, faith without action is dead (James 2:17).

Your Generation Needs Godly Wisdom

This generation has unprecedented access to information yet often lacks clarity. God is calling young people to choose wisdom over trends, purpose over popularity, and truth over hype. He is raising modern Daniels and Esthers, grounded, discerning, and courageous.

Wisdom remains the better treasure, more valuable than silver or gold (Proverbs 3:13–14). It is still the principal thing. Seek it. Treasure it. Walk in it. And let it shape a life that honors God and transforms the world.


Student and Tentmaking: My Journey with The Kingdom Projects

Raising Disciple-Making Leaders:

A Biblical Blueprint for Kingdom Impact



Introduction

We are in a generation, when spiritual leadership viz a viz disciple-making, is a challenge within the Body of Christ. No doubt the Church of Christ is blessed with leaders, but how many are really making disciples for Christ as we are commanded by the Lord? The Church does not need motivational speakers or program coordinators, who probably are not disciples themselves; it is impossible to take people to where they have not been. The Church needs leaders with Kingdom character—men and women who not only carry a vision but also reproduce that vision in others. In a culture saturated with shallow definitions of leadership, we must return to the Bible's timeless model: a leader is first a disciple-maker. The Bible articulates what it means to live and lead with the heart of Christ and provides us with guidelines for true leadership that begins with personal transformation that culminates in the transformation of others.

What Is Leadership?

Leadership is not about titles or positions. At its core, leadership is the ability to frame effective plans, influence others toward godly goals, mobilize people without manipulating them, and stepping away without creating a vacuum. In short, a true leader not only accomplishes tasks effectively but also empowers others to do the same—ensuring sustainability and legacy.

Who Then Is a Leader?

A leader is someone who knows what to do, how to do it, and can inspire others to follow through—even in their absence. Their influence is not based on charisma but on conviction and consistency. They model the very lifestyle they preach.

The Biblical Leadership Template

Apostle Paul in 1 Timothy 3:1–7 and Titus 2:1–15 outlines the foundational values of leadership, not in terms of corporate strategy, but Christ-like character. These values in one way or another affect your leadership influence and hinder your ability to make disciples. Let's examine a few:

Personal Values

- Not a lover of money: Free from materialism
- Not quarrelsome: Peace-loving and emotionally mature
- Respectable: Carries moral authority
- Self-control and discipline: Able to govern emotions and actions

Family Values

- Manages his household well: The home is a leader's first ministry
- Loves and nurtures his family: Leadership without love is tyranny
- Respected by children: A reflection of relational integrity

Ministry Values

- Not a novice: Maturity in faith is key

- Able to teach: Effective in discipleship and doctrine
- Diligent: Not lazy in Kingdom responsibilities
Community Values
- Respected by outsiders: Leadership is tested in public
- Credible even among unbelievers: Integrity beyond the pulpit

The Call to Disciple-Making

The Lord Jesus didn't say, "Go and gather church members." He said, "Go and make disciples" (Matthew 28:19). Discipleship is God's method of shaping lives, communities, and nations. Discipleship is God's way of making men. "Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men." – Matthew 4:19. It is God's strategy and ideal for building lasting kingdom impact. A Christian leader who does not produce disciples is not functioning in his or her full capacity as a Kingdom builder who operates in Christ's clear instruction and authority (Matthew 28:18-20). As a leader in the Body of Christ, if no one is under studying, imitating or following you in faith, vision, or growth, you're not leading in an actual sense.

True Leadership is Reproducible

The leadership that will build the Body of Christ and bring about a long-lasting legacy that produces change in character among men must be done intentionally; it also involves relationship and it must be reproducible. You are not a leader if you work alone in the ministry with no successors, you run vision-based initiatives without shared ownership, or you make noise about God's mission, but no one listens or catches the fire. A true leader multiplies themselves. They ignite purpose in others and raise a generation of Kingdom-minded believers.

Conclusion

Leadership in God's Kingdom is not about visibility—it's about spiritual responsibility. If you're not making disciples, you're not building God's Kingdom. Check your core values and make a careful examination of yourself. The measure of leadership is not just in having mere followers, but in having disciples (followers of Christ), who are faithful and bear fruit that lasts.

So, we ask: Are you a leader (a disciple-maker) or a program-runner?

Let this be our prayer and pursuit: to become the kind of leaders who follow Christ so closely that others can't help but follow us too.

"If you are not a disciple-maker, you are not a leader in the body of Christ."

With a teeming population of over 3.5 billion people yet to hear the gospel, scattered across the nations- in the campuses, in the marketplace, in the business hubs, on the streets, in the cities, in the villages, on the trains, aircrafts, in the pubs, the brothels, in the slums, among the highly educated and also among the illiterates, among the frontier people groups, in religious and non-religious climes, God still needs vessels to use. May you be a vessel that God can use. May your life and ministry bring progress to the mission of God on Earth. Amen!

regulations as righteous and fair as this body of instructions that I am giving you today?

Verse 6 in Good News Translation:

Obey them faithfully, and this will show the people of other nations how wise you are. When they hear of all these laws, they will say, "What wisdom and understanding this great nation has!"

- Because GOD showcased Joseph, it became crystal clear that a dream given by GOD to a man living for GOD can never be shattered by adversities or adversaries. May JEHOVAH showcase you.
- On a sober note, someone may not know that GOD can give and withdraw graces, anointing, and HIS presence, except by the way HE demonstrated it in Samson! Samson became a showcase of Romans 11:21 & 22. *For if GOD did not spare the natural branches, HE may not spare you either. Therefore consider the goodness and severity of GOD: On those who fell, severity; but toward you, goodness, if you continue in HIS goodness. Otherwise, you also will be cut off.* This one is on a negative note. I pray that this will not be your portion, but please be careful.



What began as a U.S.-based coaching firm quickly revealed a powerful truth: international leaders were hungry for mentorship. Though many could not afford U.S. coaching rates, Gordon refused to turn them away. Instead, he offered group coaching and mentoring to help pastors, principals, superintendents, and community leaders grow their influence in churches, schools, and neighborhoods worldwide.

In 2024, he expanded that mission by founding Gordon Leadership Foundation, now serving leaders across 40 underserved countries, including Barbados, Antigua and Barbuda, Uganda, and India. Through partnerships with The Kingdom Project and speaking at the Global Impact Summit in Entebbe, Uganda, GLF advances its bold vision: a world where every leader has a certified coach and mentor to maximize their impact.



EXCEEDING THE LIMITS

So I prophesied as He commanded me, and breath came into them, and they lived, and stood upon their feet, an exceedingly great army.

Ezekiel 37:10 (NKJV)

Down through the ages, many limitations have held back many people and turn them to dwarf. God's army into which you have enlisted is called and configured to exceed every form of limitations set by the enemy.

As I bathed in the euphoria of the picture the LORD is painting to us in Ezekiel 37:10, my attention was arrested by the word Exceedingly. At the surface level, it may look like a tautology, putting that word before another similar word, great. If someone or something is already "great," why add "exceedingly"? But as I look intently, I discovered that the word exceedingly is serving a multi-purpose function and helping us to see the picture the LORD is painting more clearly.

Exceeding or exceedingly can be used as:

- As a Verb: Here it means going beyond a limit.
- As an Adverb: It speaks of doing something extraordinarily, exceptionally, and in an outstanding manner.
- As an Adjective: It describes the Army of the Lord as going beyond the normal or the usual expectation.

The first light that shone into my heart as I consider this multi-purpose word is that: The army God is raising is unstoppable by the things that stop others. This army is illimitable. You and I are configured by the LORD to exceed every limit.

LIMITS

Limits are things that say 'you cannot go beyond this point' 'you cannot reach your GOD-given potential' 'you cannot be better than this' 'you cannot overcome this sin' Limits say (whispering or screaming) YOU CANNOT BECOME WHAT GOD CREATED YOU TO BE.

Can these limits be broken and be exceeded? Capital yes! Let's take a look at some of the limit setters and how the people of GOD down through the ages have shattered those limits and reached their potentials and fulfilled their dreams.

LIMIT SETTERS

1. Birth place and birth condition

1st Chronicles 4:9&10 Now Jabez was more honorable than his brothers, and his mother called his name Jabez, saying, "Because I bore him in pain." [10](#) And Jabez called on the God of Israel saying, "Oh, that You would bless me indeed, and enlarge my territory, that Your hand would be with me, and that You would keep me from evil, that I may not cause pain!" So God granted him what he requested.

Genesis 35:18 (Rachel, Jacob's wife) And so it was, as her soul was departing (for she died), that she called his name Ben-Oni; but his father called him Benjamin.

For many people, the place and the circumstances of their birth had set a limit on their lives. They agree with that limit, live by it, and die within it. But we see a different template in scripture.

Consider Jabez. His birth condition set a limit for him; he was born in sorrow, and his name reflected that pain. But one day, he got angry in his spirit and decided to exceed that limit. Heaven is waiting to support you when you get angry with the limits set by the enemy.

I read a testimony given by Kenneth Hagin of blessed memory long ago. One day, the Lord Jesus appeared to him. He was showing him the future of the organization he was leading. He said, Jesus was telling him many astonishing things. Those things were hard to believe, except you are someone who has been walking with GOD and you know that GOD says what he means and means everything he says.

But as that conversation was going on, one terrible, ugly, horrible, strange creature, just jumped in. Hagin looked at the face of Jesus and wondered in himself, how could

such a strange fellow get here? Jesus continued to talk. The horrible creature didn't stop his gymnastic and distractions, jumping and doing funny things. Of course, Kenneth Higgins was distracted. He expected JESUS to do something about the stranger's actions. But interestingly, JESUS continued to talk and He won't repeat any statement that the stranger caused him to miss. So, anger started building up inside of Hagin. At a point, he looked at the terrible creature squarely and thundered at him: "I bind you in the name of Jesus Christ". Instantly, the creature became still and stiff! Haggin issued another command: "I pull you down in the name of Jesus Christ". It's working! It's working! He issued another command: "I cast you out of this place in the name of Jesus Christ". The ugly creature rolled and screamed and disappeared. As Haggin was calming down from his anger, JESUS gave him a loving gaze and said with a smile: "son, you think I will do that for you? That's left for you to do. I've done all I needed to do on the cross of Calvary. You are to maximize calvary and standing on the finished work. When you take action, I will back you up"

This must be the same revelation that changed the story of Jabez and removed the limit placed on him by birth.

Hannah said in 1st Samuel 2:8 that "GOD raises the poor from the dust and lifts the beggar from the ash heap. To set them among princes and make inherit the throne of glory. For the pillars of the earth are the LORD'S..." Hannah knew what she was saying, that God can pick anybody from zero level and take him to hero level.

There was another man whose birthplace and birth condition could have placed horrible limits upon him. But thank God, his father was very sensitive. In Genesis chapter 35 verse 18, Rachel was in labour and was dying, so she named her baby Ben-Oni ("Son of Sorrow"). But his father, Jacob, sprang up and cancelled that limitation immediately, declaring, "No! His name shall be called Benjamin, the Son of My Right Hand". Jacob put right what the enemy meant to be wrong.

If your limitation today is your background, if you think, "My village is not on the map," or "My parents didn't go to school", I pray for you. The God who raises the poor from the dust will raise you up and empower you to exceed every limit set by your birth.

2. Mindset

A second limit setter is mindset; an established frame of mind. Some people are configured to see obstacles even when there are none. When the twelve spies were sent out, ten allowed their mindset to limit them, but Joshua and Caleb exceeded that limit because they saw opportunity where others saw obstacles.

Let the Word of God renew your mind. Philippians 2:5 says, "Let this mind be in you which was in Christ Jesus". We must refuse the mindset of the Israelites who, when God said "Go forward," were mentally going backward to the onions of Egypt.

3. Age

Age places limits on people in two ways: feeling too young or feeling too old.

- **Too Young:** Paul told Timothy, "Let no one despise your youth." Do not let age dictate your direction. Hophni and Phinehas missed God's best because they were careless in their youth.
- **Too Old:** Some feel too old to attempt great things. But look at prophet Haggai. He was an old man when he began to prophesy, yet his voice turned the tide for Israel.

To every retiree and senior citizens reading this message: May the Lord remove every limitation of age. You will enjoy divine health. You will go from strength to strength.

4. Location

Your location or environment must not set a limit on your holiness, inner purity or your fruitfulness. Some believe that you cannot be holy in certain countries. What a lie! We have brethren in America, Australia, and Canada who are on fire for the Lord. They go out for evangelism. Even in winter, snow cannot slow them down! Joseph exceeded the limit of Egypt, and Daniel exceeded the limit in Babylon.

If GOD has placed you in a rural setting for the purpose of reaching a cluster of rural population, don't repost yourself. Your provision will meet you on your duty post. I recall a brother who lived in a village called Lanwa, sometimes in the year 2000. When God was ready to turn his situation around, he

received a Suzuki 120 motorcycle and a Toyota Starlet within one week. The motorcycle miracle happened because I met him trekking on a very sunny afternoon, while returning from a particular village where he had gone to disciple a convert. My heart was moved. As I was thinking of what to do to alleviate the hardship, the brother who was with me in my Volkswagen Beetle Car spoke up: "sir, what if we donate our Suzuki motorcycle to this brother? That was it! We did! The same week, a car came from a person in Lagos who had a parking constraint and was moved by God to sow it into this brother's life.

Do not let your location limit you. God can prosper you right where you are.



5. Economy

For some, the economy places a limit on their service to God. They say, "when things get better financially, we would do big things for God".

But look at Peter in Acts 3:6. He said, "Silver and gold I do not have, but what I have I give you". The economy did not limit him because he knew he had something greater than money. You must exceed the limit of financial lack. Ministry is a partnership with God, and when you partner with Him, the only direction is forward and upward.

6. Natural Ability

In the Parable of the Talents (Matthew 25), the Master gave to each according to his own ability. It is wrong to look at your natural ability as a restriction. You might say, "I don't have as much energy or intellectual capacity as others." But the man with two talents also exceeded his limit; he traded and gained two more.

Whether you have five talents or one, trade with it. Bring profit to the Kingdom of God. Do not let "ability" be your excuse.

7. Political Situations

Political instability has limited some believers. However, Elijah, Elisha, Isaiah, and Jeremiah thrived under difficult political environments.

In the book of Jeremiah, King Jehoiakim got angry with Jeremiah. He seized the scroll containing the prophecies of Jeremiah as written by his secretary, Baruch. He burnt them all. He tried to arrest Jeremiah, but the Lord hid him. Did Jeremiah stop? No. He rose up, encouraged himself, and dictated the words again. Because he exceeded that political limit, today we have the Book of Jeremiah and Lamentations.

I declare that the political atmosphere in the country where you live, will not limit the Gospel. Every restriction placed by the enemy through politics is destroyed in the name of Jesus.

8. Spiritual Leaders

This is a delicate but important matter. Spiritual leadership can unknowingly set a limit on people in two ways.

- The Limit of a Leader's Flaws: Do not let the faults of a leader stop your growth. Samuel grew up under Eli. He lived in the same place with Hophni and Phinehas, yet he did not fall where they fell. Be careful that the weakness of a leader does not become your ceiling.
- A Leader's Comfort: Sometimes a leader, out of a good spirit, may ask you to stop or rest. Elijah told Elisha three times, "Stay here," but Elisha refused

to accept that limit because he wanted the double portion.

You must handle this delicately, with the fear of God, but you must press on and exceed the limit set by your leader. Respect your leader, but don't let any flaw, fault, shortcoming or whatever you might have noticed in your leader place a limit upon you.

9. Laziness

Laziness can place a severe limit on somebody's life. There are two dimensions to laziness: (1) folding your hands and doing nothing. (2) abandoning your own job description and becoming a busybody in another person's assignment. You must not entertain laziness. Know your job description, be serious with it, and let God praise you for whatever has been committed to your hands.

10. Sin

Finally, sin has set and is still setting limit on the lives of people today. It limited King Saul, the descendants of Eli, and Judas Iscariot. In the name of JESUS CHRIST, sin will not have power over you. Look at some of the heroes of faith who exceeded limits: Noah exceeded the limit set by the lawlessness of his generation, Joseph exceeded sexual pressure, and Esther exceeded protocol to save her people.

CONCLUSION

As you are reading this, if you are a student and it appears the enemy has placed a limit upon your faculty or your brain, making it difficult to think out of the box or solve problems, that restriction is lifted now in the name of JESUS CHRIST.

Every Christian Professional reading this will from today begin to exceed limits. The LORD makes you a solution giver in your working place. As Potiphar's business prospered because of Joseph, so the institution where you are now will prosper because of you.

You will reach your potential. You will fulfil your dream. Receive grace, receive strength, and receive the anointing to continue to exceed every limit.

You are God's Exceedingly Great Army.
